Also, providing parallel programs and incentives such as holding competitions, exhibitions and idea banks, designing games (physical and computer) and allocating appropriate discounts and financial facilities by municipalities to children can be very helpful.

Here are the relevant suggestions in general:

- Prepare and implement a joint cooperation action plan between the municipality (pilot in Tehran and in the long term for the whole country) and the Ministry of Education to educate smart children.
- Prepare and teach a manual for educating smart citizens in primary schools.
- Organize competitions and competitions commissioned by the municipality and with the participation of schools, and implement the best ideas and provide them with material and moral encouragement (support for ideas).
- Produce a proposed program (application) for methods of encouraging and awarding points to smart children so that municipalities can offer discounts (for example, on the cost of a club, swimming pool or playhouse, etc.).
- Promote social capital in neighborhoods in the long term through citizens with an emphasis on children, and develop a sharing economy for the optimal use of resources and spaces and the ownership of individuals (such as sharing bicycles, additional household items and even parking lots, etc.).
- Immediately develop curricula, methods and educational tools related to educating smart citizens among children in the Ministry of Education.
